Who May Apply - Any graduating African American high school senior who:

1. Has earned a grade point average of 3.0 or above.
2. Has career goals that require education beyond high school. Preference will be given to those students seeking careers in the performing arts.

- 2. **JOHN MARSHALL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - Awarded in memory of John Marshall, a SCUSD teacher, who supervised a Sacramento Links project designed to assist at-risk students.

Who May Apply - Any graduating African American high school senior who:

1. Has earned a grade point average of 2.5 or above.
2. Has career goals that require education or training beyond high school. Preference will be given to those students who seek vocational training

- 3. **GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Who May Apply- Any graduating African American high school senior who:

1. Has earned a grade point average of 3.0 or above.
2. Has career goals that require higher education beyond high school. Preference will be given to those students who seek careers in an area other than the performing arts or vocational training.
